William Byrd (1674-1744) was a wealthy Virginian. A member of the colonial landed gentry, he was born in Virginia but educated in England. His first wife Lucy died of smallpox on joining her husband in England in November 1716. Throughout the period of his two year stay in London, Byrd, in addition to the sexual exploits noted in his diary, courted various wealthy heiresses, without success. He eventually remarried in 1724. His diary was written in shorthand, and was clearly not expected to see the light of day. Throughout Byrd hides the identity of many people by missing characters out of their names.

These extracts, taken alone, suggest relentless sexual activity, but readers should note that Byrd made an entry every single day, from 13th December 1717 to his departure from England on 13th December 1719 (and in fact until the Diary ends on 19th May 1721). I have extracted all material which relates to sexual behaviour of any kind during Byrd's stay in London, and also that which may relate to ill health. Clearly there is ambiguity in the language used.

You should think about the following questions. What forms of sexual activity did Byrd indulge in? To what extent was this 'high risk' behaviour? Would you agree he was 'notoriously promiscuous' during this period? What do these entries suggest about 'gentlemanly' sexual behaviour' in this period?
